GENERAL PROGRAM GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

1. Providing education in which the essential learning activity is interaction with patients under the guidance and supervision of faculty members who give value, context, and meaning to those interactions.
2. Helping residents develop the skills, knowledge, and attitudes leading to proficiency in all the domains of clinical competency within the major subspecialties of diagnostic radiology.
3. Requiring the physician to assume personal responsibility for the care of individual patients.
4. Providing graded and progressive responsibility such that as residents gain experience and demonstrate growth in their ability to care for patients, they assume roles that permit them to exercise those skills with greater independence.
5. Providing experiential education within the context of the health care delivery system on the local, regional, and national levels.
6. Teaching residents to practice radiology semi-independently during training such that upon graduation of the program they will be prepared to enter the unsupervised practice of medicine.
7. Providing a training program which establishes a foundation for continued professional growth.
