This consists of instilling air and barium and is done in a similar manner to the routine barium enema. *NOTE: This routine prep will not be used if a barium enema is ordered after 1800

The importance of hydration cannot be overstressed.

Give two fluid ounces of castor oil at 1800.

Give nothing by mouth after midnight (no foods or fluid)

Administer a Fleet Ready-To-Use Bisacodyl Enema at 0600. (This is 10mg in 37cc., obtained from Pharmacy). This is not Fleet Enema.

Give no later than 0700.

Shake well prior to use.

Should be administered at least one hour prior to examination and retained for 15 minutes.

Although 1800 is the preferred time, the castor

oil may be given up to 2200 (10:00 pm)

Pediatric Age Group (up to 17 years of age):

Under 6 months Enema only

6 months to 3 years 1/2 oz Castor Oil (1 Tbs.)

3 years to 8 years 1 oz. Castor Oil (2 Tbs.)

8 years and over 2 oz. Castor Oil (5 Tbs.)

Give the castor oil between 1900 and 2000. For ages 8 to 17, order a clear liquid diet the evening before the test.
